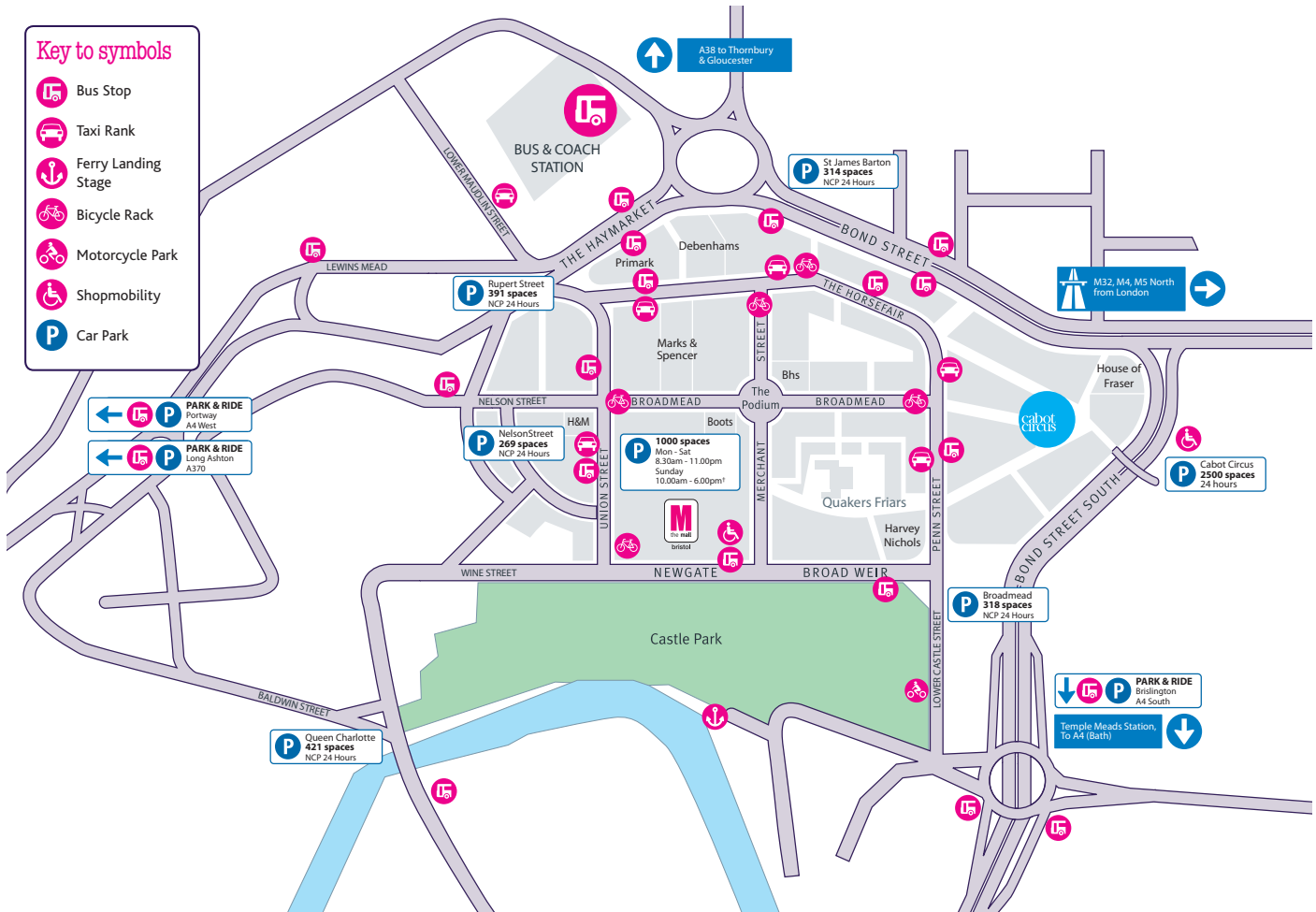


Broadmead Travel Guide

By car

Excellent road links from all directions along with over 10,000 parking spaces in central Bristol, (many with special shopper's tariffs) all contribute to making driving to Bristol quick and easy.

By bus or coach

Over 1,000 buses travel into Broadmead every day with family tickets available to keep costs down. Drop-off points are located centrally throughout the area including Union Street, The Haymarket and The Horsefair.

Three park and ride schemes operate into Bristol city centre, situated on the A4 Bath Road in Brislington, Long Ashton just of the A370 and the A4 Portway in Shirehampton. They provide free parking and an alternative way to travel into Broadmead. With over 3,100 park and ride parking spaces available just park and then ride.

By train

Bristol Temple Meads is an interchange hub for public transport. Buses to Broadmead run every few minutes, it is just a 5 minute bus transfer.

By Taxi

Bristol is well served with a wide selection of taxi firms. For your homeward journey there are numerous taxi ranks in and around the Broadmead area, all clearly marked on the map.

By ferry right into the shopping area

Sail from Temple Meads station, Hotwells or Harbourside, the ferry service conveniently drops-off at Castle Park only 2 minutes walk from the heart of Broadmead.

By air
